

## Chester Cathedral Clock re-installed

The clock installed in Chester Cathedral in 1873 has lain unused in the Addleshaw Tower for many years. In December 2013 it was dismantled, removed and hoisted in pieces, back up into its original clockroom. The clock was removed and reinstallation of the clock by Smith of Derby. It never had a dial so only told the time by striking on bells, but at present there are no plans for it to strike again.

As part of the 'Chester at Height' project the room has been restored and the clock is now in position with a new auto-wind unit and is working again. The tower opened to the public at Easter 2014.
